



Integrity Built

The Mino Oski Ain Dah Yung will be a 42-unit supportive housing project on University Avenue in St. Paul geared toward homeless, American Indian young adults between 18 and 24. Developed in partnership between the Ain Dah Yung Center and Project for Pride in Living, the four-story, 50,000 SF project aims to help the young adults reconnect with their culture and learn to live independently. It features gathering spaces for cultural ceremonies, workshops for bead-working and drum-making, a sweat lodge, a sacred medicine garden, classrooms, a technology center, job training and other support services.

This project includes financing through various Public and private entities. The

project is slated to begin construction early this fall, wrapping in summer 2019.
